debugging

our hero: set -x

set -x prints out every line of a script as it executes, with all the variables expanded!

#!/bin/bash I usually set -x put set -x at the top

or bash -x

\$ bash -x script.sh
does the same thing as
putting set -x at the
top of script.sh

you can stop before every line

trap read DEBUG

the DEBUG "signal" is triggered before every line of code

a fancy step debugger trick

put this at the start of your script to confirm every line before it runs:

trap '(read -p "[\$BASH_SOURCE:\$LINENO] \$BASH_COMMAND")' DEBUG

read -p prints a script line next command
message, press filename number that will run
enter to continue

how to print better error messages

this die function:

die() { echo \$1 >&2; exit 1; }

lets you exit the program and print a message if a command fails, like this:

some_command || die "oh no!"
